

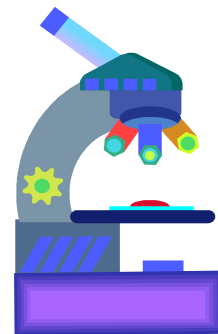

Survive Chemistry Fundamentals I (CHM 2045)...By following these 12 Easy Steps

- 1. Make flashcards** for polyatomic ions, solubility rules, strong acids/bases, and conversion factors.
- 2. Read BEFORE you come to class.** It will make much more sense to you in class if you have seen the material before, even if you did not understand it when you read it the first time.
- 3. Do not try to write down everything your professor says word for word.** Jot down the main significant points and formulas. You can find the minor concepts in your textbook for further explanation.
- 4. Get the solutions manual.** It will help you if you are struggling with problem solving because it shows how to solve problems step by step.
- 5. Look over you notes from the previous lectures once a day.** The more you look at the material, the more it makes sense and the less scary it looks.
- 6. Do not procrastinate!** If you put off studying until the night before the test you will not be successful in this class.
- 7. Do not hesitate to stop and ask the professor if you do not understand a concept being explained.** If it does not make sense now, chances are good that it will not make sense tomorrow either and someone else probably has the same question as you.
- 8. Form a study group.** The best way to learn material is to teach it to someone else.
- 9. Review your tests as soon as you get them back.** Work out each problem again, even if you got it right, because there is a good chance you will see a similar problem on the next test and the final.
- 10. Make reading, homework time and SARC tutoring part of your daily schedule.** SARC Peer Tutoring is here to help you succeed.
