

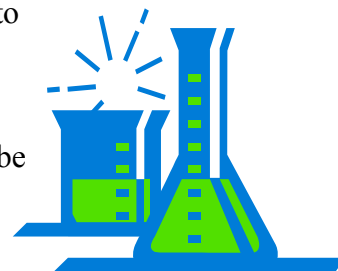

Survive Chemistry Fundamentals II (CHM 2046)...By following these 10 Easy Steps

- 1. Print out lecture notes BEFORE class.** Put a star or question mark next to topics you do not understand and ask your professor or peer tutor for help.
- 2. DO NOT SKIP CLASS.** You will never be able to make up for lost lecture time. Active listening in class is the key.
- 3. Manage your time.** Make a schedule of when you are going to study and stick to it.
- 4. Study at SARC and in groups.** Going to SARC to study during Chemistry tutorial sessions is a great time to study. If there is a concept that you don't understand you can ask a tutor without having to wait for next class.
- 5. Make review sheets!** Go over your notes each day and make a sheet with some key points of the day's notes. Spend 10 minutes each day reviewing your notes and you will be prepared for the upcoming quiz or exam.
- 6. Read BEFORE you come to class.** It will make much more sense to you in class if you have seen the material before, even if you did not understand it when you read it the first time.
- 7. Do the problems within the chapters.** Workout sample problems in the chapter as you read. The answers are worked out for you. If there is a step you do not understand, mark it and ask for help.
- 8. Review your tests as soon as you get them back.** Work out each problem again, even if you got it right, because there is a good chance you will see a similar problem on the next test and the final.
- 9. RELAX!** Take a breath, don't over work yourself. Take a break.
- 10. Make reading, homework time and SARC tutoring part of your daily schedule.** SARC Peer Tutoring is here to help you succeed.
