Do you know that the Student Academic Resource Center...

Has a mission to assist undergraduate students in their transition to the university, mastery of learning strategies and study skills necessary for success at the collegiate level, progress toward successful completion of degree requirements, and through their progress toward graduation.

In 2008, the Student Academic Resource Center...

- Received the First Year Advocate Award from the Learning and Interacting with New Knights Program as voted on by UCF freshmen students.
- Provided academic advising and support to 622 first-time-in-college (FTIC) students within four different academic advising populations. Recorded over 3,000 contacts with these students through academic advising appointments and group advising sessions.
- Peer mentors recorded over 21,000 contacts with FTIC students associated with SARC academic advising populations.
- Had more than 110,000 visits to the web site at <http://www.sarc.sdes.ucf.edu>.
- Provided free tutorial services to over 13,300 students in 48 subject areas.
- Provided free weekly supplemental instruction (SI) sessions to over 26,600 students in 51 different class sections.
- Facilitated 125 Academic Success workshops reaching over 5,500 students.
- Provided assistance during finals week serving over 3,000 students.

Where can UCF students go for help?

The Student Academic Resource Center provides the following services and resources:

- Academic advising for four student populations: Pegasus Success Program, College Achievement Program, Supporting Teacher Education Program, and Spring Admitted FTIC students.
- Peer mentors providing transition assistance to the students in the Pegasus Success Program, College Achievement Program, and Supporting Teacher Education Program through advising and outreach programming
- Five pre-college Mastering College Level Coursework seminars, to assist first time in college students with the transition from high school to college
- Two annual Learning Fairs for UCF students to promote effective college level study and learning skills
- Free peer tutoring and supplemental instruction sessions in over 45 different subject areas
- Peer tutors and SI leaders conduct review session during the fall and spring week of finals
